GINGERBREAD HOUSE This float was "baked" by the PACE Elf Chefs in 2014. A 14'x 8' Gingerbread House created and built with sheets of gingerbread made of plywood and insulation, painted with customized Gingerbread paint. The roof is covered with 120 hand painted peppermints and gum drops. This is the third gingerbread house in the history of the parade.

This float was built in 1993 starting with a farm wagon with steel wheels, and is one of the original hayracks.

The focus is on the little boy in the playground with his tongue stuck /frozen to the flag pole, the famous Leg Lamp that dad was so proud of, the Red Ryder BB Gun that Ralphie tried to convince everyone that it was the best Christmas present and the eye glasses that got busted when he fired the BB gun! The 7 foot poly leg was made in Gibbon, Nebraska.

CHRISTMAS UNDER THE SEA The mermaid sits in a 7 foot shell created in 1993. In 2005 the new base was redesigned to make this float a little more interesting and bring it down to street level. The shell and ship are constructed out of a wood frame with wire and plaster mesh Arial is seen on the float each year with her sea creatures. Even the creatures under the sea celebrate the holiday season.

STAGECOACH – COWGIRL & COWBOY CHRISTMAS These Cow-folk are headed to a great holiday season. This PACE unit was made in 1993 and was upgraded with new cactus, more authentic wagon wheels and the decorative western medallions. Cowboy/Cowgirl Christmas was once the gold Cinderella carriage that had been in the parade for twenty years. When the current Cinderella was donated to the parade by Lakeview Museum the Stagecoach float was created. The horses and coach are all that remains from the original float. The float was remodeled in 2014 with new paint and added mementos

FLINTSTONES CHRISTMAS FOLLIES Yabba Dabba Do – Welcome to BEDROCK and the Bedrock Diner. Drive up and have a BRONTO BURGER AND RIBS WITH ONION RINGS AND A CHOCOLATE SHAKE! The diner was constructed in 2007 with chicken wire and the whole float was Covered with spray foam and then painted. The cars were constructed with wood and burlap and fiberglass plastic board for the wheels. The diner includes a playground area for the children.

OLD WOMEN IN A SHOE There was an Old Woman who lived in a shoe, she had so many children she did not know what to do...so she brought them to the longest continuous running Santa Parade in the nation!!! This float along with the Conestoga & Circus Wagon are the oldest units in the parade. The Peoria Area Telephone Pioneers Retirees had maintained this unit for many years. In 2000 they donated the float to the parade. The Santa Parade elves updated the float in 2008 by repainting and trimming the shoe, recarpeting the float and installing windows to this classic shoe.

FROSTY THE SNOWMAN Frosty has been a part of this Santa parade since 1976. (In 1976 all the floats were vandalized while being stored at EXPO Gardens.) PACE elves refurbished the float in 2009 with new "snow" and a paint job and a new hat, scarf and gloves.

CONESTOGA WAGON This float is one of the oldest units in the Parade along with the Old Women Who Lived in a Shoe, going back 134 years. This original float depicts the travel to the Midwest in the early days and celebrating Christmas on the journey.

CINDERELLA Cinderella was part for the 1996 Lakeview Museum Gala Event. Lakeview Museum donated this lovely float to PACE. Volunteers made the carriage mobile, by mounting the coach onto a trailer. Cinderella rides in the float and she accompanied by many of her friends. The 28 feet long carriage & horses are made of Styrofoam and fiberglass, fully upholstered on the interior. The beautiful horses pulling the carriage which were added to the float in 2015 along with the cobblestone road that the carriage now rides on. This float is accompanied by costumed characters

PIRATE TREASURE SHIP This Pirate "Magical Mayfly" Treasure Ship was created in 1998 for the Lakeview Museum's fund raising gala and after the Gala donated it to the parade. The ship is constructed primarily of wood. Complete with a mast and sails and fans to send this Mayfly along if there is not enough wind. In 2011 the ocean waves foamed and painted under the ship.

CHRISTMAS AROUND THE WORLD - Every country celebrates the holiday season in a different way and PACE recognizes this with a giant globe. The globe was created with the help of the engineers from Bradley University, The earth sits on an original Santa parade flatbed that has been around for many years. The globe is constructed with a wood frame, covered with chicken wire and then covered plaster sheets. Then painted with the countries on the globe. It took a few tries to create such a large sphere. A hot air balloon was tried but deflated overnight.
